HOW TO USE YOUR ROSARY BOOKLET

We pray the Rosary with our fingers and our lips. However, we will pray it more fruitfully when we also learn to pray with our minds and hearts. The Bible tells us, *Pray with the spirit and you will pray with understanding.* (1 Corinthians)

THE MYSTERIES

Beginning on page 5, you will find each of the 20 mysteries of the Rosary with its traditional title and a brief rephrasing of its meaning. After that, you will see the fruit of the mystery that should be prayed for.

This is followed by a short reflection on the event in the life of Our Lord or Our Lady that is being meditated on. Since every event in salvation history calls for a response from us, a suggestion is then given by which we may personalize the mystery. You may choose this one, or any insight given by the Spirit.

Saint John Paul II suggested, with the addition of the Mysteries of Light, that the Joyful Mysteries be recited on Monday and Saturday, the Sorrowful Mysteries on Tuesday and Friday, the Glorious Mysteries on Wednesday and Sunday and the new Mysteries of Light on Thursday.



GOD STILL SPEAKS

All prayer is a dialogue. The Rosary is no different. We listen to God as well as speak to Him. For each mystery, Christ speaks to us in the short quote from Scripture. If you are able, you may wish to go deeper by reading the longer Bible readings that are listed.

Inspired by these words, you will pray the beads of each mystery with greater understanding and love as you accustom yourself to imitate what the mysteries contain.



THE BEAD PRAYERS

The chart on page 25 indicates the prayers to be said on each of the beads. The text of the prayers is given beginning on page 26.

1ST JOYFUL MYSTERY: THE ANNUNCIATION

(or how the good news first came to Mary)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: HUMILITY

EVENT

God's people waited thousands of years for the Redeemer to come. The good news was first made known to a humble virgin in a poor village. God asked for her cooperation.

OUR RESPONSE

Through Sacred Scripture, our prayer and the words of others, we can hear what God's will for us is. We must be humble enough to listen and follow it.

GOD'S WORD

Let it be done to me as you have said

Luke 1:38

READINGS

Matthew 1:18-25; Luke 1:26-38

2ND JOYFUL MYSTERY: THE VISITATION

(or how the good news was given to others)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: LOVE OF NEIGHBOR

EVENT

Having believed God's word, Mary traveled to help her relative Elizabeth who, though old, was expecting a child. Mary stayed with her until St. John the Baptist was born.

OUR RESPONSE

Our love for others, placing them before ourselves, is not always easy. When we do, however, we are blessed like Mary.

GOD'S WORD

Nothing is impossible to God.

Luke 1:37

READING

Luke 1:39-58

3RD JOYFUL MYSTERY: THE NATIVITY

(or the way Christ chose to come among us)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: POVERTY OF SPIRIT

EVENT

The Son of God assumed a human nature and was born in a humble stable. Poor shepherds and wealthy magi both came to worship Him.

OUR RESPONSE

Jesus, though God, chose to be born poor and humble. If we choose humility and poverty of spirit, He will lead us toward eternal life.

GOD'S WORD

Do not be afraid. Behold, I bring you news of great joy.

READINGS

Matthew 2:1-23; Luke 2:1-20

4TH JOYFUL MYSTERY: THE PRESENTATION

(or the Messiah's first visit to God's temple)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: OBEDIENCE

EVENT

Jesus is God, so there was no need for Him to undergo Jewish ritual. But Mary and Joseph remained obedient to the law and brought Him to the Temple, where Simeon and Anna recognized Him as the Messiah.

OUR RESPONSE

Obedience to God's law will make us a sign of contradiction to the world, just like Jesus. Although we may be rejected, we are called to obey God's law.

GOD'S WORD

And a sword will pierce your own soul, too.

Luke 2:35

READING

Luke 2:22-38

5TH **JOYFUL MYSTERY:**

THE FINDING IN THE TEMPLE

(or where to look for Christ)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: JOY IN FINDING JESUS

EVENT

Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem after Passover. Three days later, Mary and Joseph found Him in the Temple talking to the teachers of the law. They were both surprised and joyful to find Him.

OUR RESPONSE

Our spiritual lives are founded on searching for Jesus. We find Him through prayer and the practice of our faith. When we find Him, we are filled with joy.

GOD'S WORD

His mother stored up all these things in her heart.

Luke 2:52

READING

Luke 2:41-52

1ST MYSTERY OF LIGHT: BAPTISM OF JESUS CHRIST

(or how important is our Baptism)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: OPENNESS TO THE HOLY SPIRIT

EVENT

Jesus asked his cousin, John, to baptize Him. As Jesus rose from the waters of the Jordan River, the sky opened, the Spirit of God descended as a dove, and God said: "This is my beloved Son. With whom I am well pleased."

OUR RESPONSE

When we were baptized, the Holy Trinity came to dwell in our souls. The Holy Spirit, the third person of the Trinity, will move our hearts and minds toward God if we stay open to His grace.

GOD'S WORD

I am baptizing you with water, for repentance; but He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.

Matthew 3:11

READINGS

Matthew 3:11-17

2ND MYSTERY OF LIGHT: THE FIRST MIRACLE AT CANA

(or how to leave all things up to Jesus)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: TO JESUS THROUGH MARY

EVENT

Jesus came to a wedding at Cana. At the banquet Mary said: "They have no more wine." She then left her son and told the manager, "Do whatever He tells you."

Jesus then changed water into excellent wine.

OUR RESPONSE

As Mary told the servants to do what Jesus asked, we must be prepared to do everything Jesus asks of us in our daily lives.

GOD'S WORD

In Cana in Galilee Jesus revealed his glory. John 2:11

READINGS

John 2:1-12

3RD MYSTERY OF LIGHT: PROCLAIMING THE KINGDOM

(or the necessity of turning to God)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: REPENTANCE AND TRUST IN GOD

EVENT

After the killing of John the Baptist, Jesus continued to announce the good news of God. He first went about alone, but later with others, proclaiming the kingdom of God, calling everyone to convert to God their heavenly Father.

OUR RESPONSE

Jesus worked extraordinarily hard to preach the message of repentance. Turning toward God and away from sin in the key to our spiritual lives.

GOD'S WORD

The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel.

READINGS

Mark 2:3-13; Luke 7:47-48

4TH MYSTERY OF LIGHT: THE TRANSFIGURATION

(or Jesus shows us that He is God)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: DESIRE FOR HOLINESS

EVENT

Jesus took Peter, James and John to a mountain to pray. While praying, his face began to shine and his clothes became dazzlingly white. Moses and Elijah were with Jesus. God the Father said: "This is my chosen Son; listen to him."

OUR RESPONSE

The transfiguration highlights the holiness of Jesus. When we desire to be holy and pray for God's will, we too will be transfigured.

GOD'S WORD

When the voice fell silent, Jesus was there alone. The disciples kept quiet, telling nothing of what they had seen at that time to anyone.

Luke 9:36

READINGS

Luke 9:28-37

5TH MYSTERY OF LIGHT:

INSTITUTION OF THE EUCHARIST

(or Jesus makes us a gift of his Body and Blood)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: ADORATION

EVENT

At the Last Supper, Jesus offered his Body and Blood as food for all his followers. He asked that we recall what he did and do it in his memory. We do this at every Mass.

OUR RESPONSE

Remembering his magnificent gift, we should receive Holy Communion often, visit the Blessed Sacrament regularly and attend Benediction whenever possible.

GOD'S WORD

This is my body, which will be given for you. This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which will be shed for you.

Luke 22:19-20

READINGS

John 13:1; Luke 22:14-20; 2 Corinthians 5:21

1ST SORROWFUL MYSTERY: THE AGONY IN THE GARDEN

(or how Christ suffered mentally)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: SORROW FOR SIN

EVENT

As He experienced fear and anguish in Gethsemane, Jesus asked the Father to spare Him. However, He followed that by saying, "Your will, not mine, be done."

OUR RESPONSE

Jesus endured what He did so that our sins could be forgiven. We whose sins are forgiven must have true contrition for what we have done.

GOD'S WORD

You should be awake, and praying.

Matthew 26:41

READINGS

Matthew 26:36-56; John 18:1-11

2ND SORROWFUL MYSTERY: THE SCOURGING

(or how Christ endured physical pain for us)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: PURITY

EVENT

Although he knew Jesus was innocent, Pilate ordered Him to be cruelly scourged. With each blow, the scourge of sin was closer to being defeated.

OUR RESPONSE

We are not called to undergo physical scourging, but rather to purify our bodies and souls by prayer and penance.

GOD'S WORD

They hated me for no reason.

John 15:25

READINGS

Mark 15:1-15; Luke 23:13-25

3RD SORROWFUL MYSTERY:

THE CROWNING WITH THORNS

(or how Christ suffered mockery)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: MORAL COURAGE

EVENT

After being whipped. Christ was mocked by the soldiers. They ridiculed Him as "King of the Jews" by dressing Him in royal purple and weaving a crown of thorns, which they placed on His head.

OUR RESPONSE

Although He was mocked, Jesus truly was the King of the Jews and the Son of God. We must show courage in standing up for the truth, even when we are ridiculed.

GOD'S WORD

My Kingdom is not of this world.

John 18:36

READINGS

Matthew 27:27-31; Mark 15:16-20

4TH SORROWFUL MYSTERY: THE CARRYING OF THE CROSS

(or the road Christ walked as an example for us)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: PATIENCE

EVENT

As He patiently struggled to carry the cross, Jesus met His Mother, Veronica, the women of Jerusalem and Simon of Cyrene, who helped Him. Throughout the ordeal, Jesus suffered with great patience, knowing what lay before Him.

OUR RESPONSE

Struggles are a part of each person's life. There will be those around us who will help us to bear them, but we are called to show patience in our sufferings, offering them along with Jesus.

GOD'S WORD

Father, forgive them; they do not know what they are doing.

Luke 23:34

READINGS

Matthew 27:32-36; John 19:17-22

5TH SORROWFUL MYSTERY: THE CRUCIFIXION

(or how Christ was obedient to death on a cross)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: PERSEVERANCE

EVENT

After reaching Calvary, Jesus was nailed to the cross, naked, between two criminals. He endured pain and abuse, praying to the Father and persevering through it all as He gave His life for us.

OUR RESPONSE

Like Jesus, we are called to be faithful to our call despite suffering. Our perseverance joins our sufferings to Christ's and helps in the redemption of the world.

GOD'S WORD

Jesus cried out in a loud voice and then gave up His spirit.

Matthew 27:50

READINGS

Matthew 27:39-56; Mark 15:29-41

1ST GLORIOUS MYSTERY: THE RESURRECTION

(or how Christ conquered sin and death)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: FAITH

EVENT

Because He was a man like us, Christ truly died. Because He was also God, he rose victorious and made it possible for us to share His triumph over sin and death.

OUR RESPONSE

When Mary Magdalene, the women, and the Apostles came to the tomb and found it empty, they believed. The resurrection is the cornerstone of our faith. We must pray to believe as they did.

GOD'S WORD

Look at my hands and my feet; yes, it is I indeed.

READINGS

Matthew 28:1-15; Luke 24:1-49

2ND GLORIOUS MYSTERY: THE ASCENSION

(or how Christ went to His Father as our advocate)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: HOPE

EVENT

For 40 days after His rising from the dead Jesus appeared to His Apostles, instructing them about God's kingdom and preparing them for the coming of the Holy Spirit. Then He left this earth until His final coming.

OUR RESPONSE

Although His glorified body is now with the Father, the promise that Jesus gave that He is with us until the end of the world gives us hope that He is present and that we will be with Him forever in heaven.

GOD'S WORD

I am with you always; yes, to the end of time. Matthew 28:20

READINGS

Luke 24:50-53; Acts 1:1-14

3RD GLORIOUS MYSTERY: THE COMING OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

(or the Spirit's witness)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: LOVE OF GOD

EVENT

The Spirit rushed like a violent wind and appeared like fiery tongues over the heads of the Apostles. This turned them from weak, timid, fearful men into courageous witnesses to the teachings of Christ.

OUR RESPONSE

The Holy Spirit abides in us and teaches us how to pray. We must always work to stir up the Spirit within us so that we can fearlessly spread the love of God to others.

GOD'S WORD

I will ask the Father and He will give you another Paraclete to be with you always.

John 15:16

READINGS

John 14:12-31; Acts 2:1-41

4TH GLORIOUS MYSTERY: THE ASSUMPTION

(or how God rewards Christian faithfulness)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: THE GRACE OF A HAPPY DEATH

EVENT

By a singular grace, Mary remained sinless throughout her life. Therefore, she was taken to heaven body and soul when her time on earth was finished. Her assumption anticipates the resurrection of our bodies at the end of time.

OUR RESPONSE

We cannot be sinless as Mary was, but we can work to imitate her patience, humility and prayerfulness. If we do, Christ promises us eternal life.

GOD'S WORD

The Almighty has done great things for me.

Luke 1:49

READINGS

Proverbs 8:1-31; Judith 13:17-20

5TH GLORIOUS MYSTERY: THE CORONATION OF OUR LADY

(or Christ's Mother in glory)

FRUIT OF THE MYSTERY: TRUST IN MARY'S INTERCESSION

EVENT

Our Lady, honored as queen in heaven, intercedes for us before God. We are called to trust in her prayers before her Son. She is our most powerful ally.

OUR RESPONSE

Let us honor Mary by praying her rosary fervently, and applying the lessons of the mysteries in our own lives


GOD'S WORD
